<p>授業テーマ</p> <p>To increase motivation, to develop public speaking skills and to provide opportunities for speaking in public</p>		
<p>授業の概要と目標</p> <p>The main aim of the course is to improve students' English ability by providing students with a variety of tasks and activities that are fun and realistic. Students awareness of aspects of English pronunciation will be increased and they will be given the opportunity practice and develop a more natural way of speaking and using English. Students will practice public speaking skills in small groups and in front of the class.</p>

<p>授業スケジュール・内容</p> <p>In the first week of semester, students will participate in icebreaking activities to get to know each other. Students will also work together to make a list of good class rules and regulations.</p> <p>In the following few weeks, simple tasks aimed at eliciting basic language patterns will be carried out. Students will be given some autonomy in selecting certain tasks and activities. As the course progresses, the tasks will become more complex and encourage the students to use language more naturally and independently. Although students will have an element of choice in determining which tasks will be carried out, the teacher will ensure that the tasks chosen will have a balance of input activities, activities that highlight aspects of form, output activities and task aimed at improving fluency and vocabulary.</p> <p>The students' performance on various tasks will orient the teacher to provide tasks that are aimed at helping students to improve the areas in which they are weak.</p> <p>Many of the tasks will be based on helping students to perform well in a public speaking environment. Students will be given opportunities to research topics for public speaking. Student will be given ample opportunity to make presentations to the class. This will first take place in small groups before presenting to the whole class.</p> <p>The second semester will follow in the same vein with students being exposed to a wide variety of tasks aimed at improving many aspects of oral and conversational English.</p>
